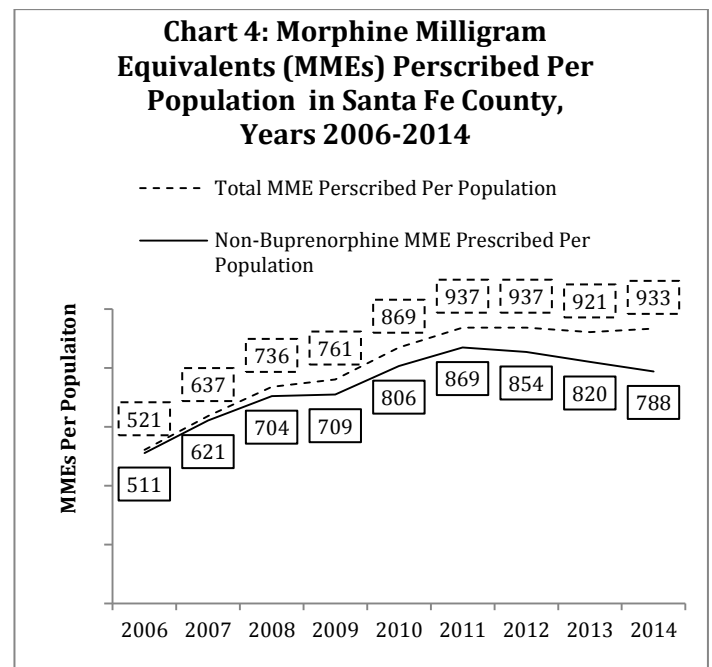
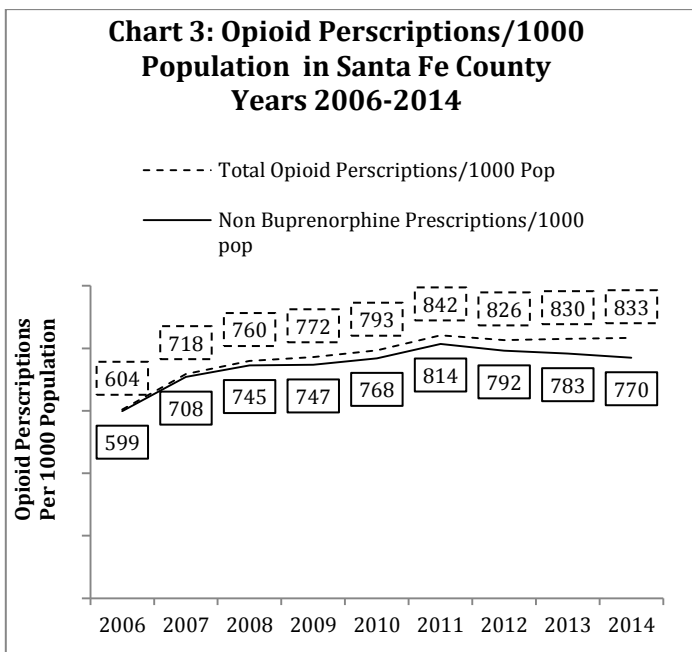
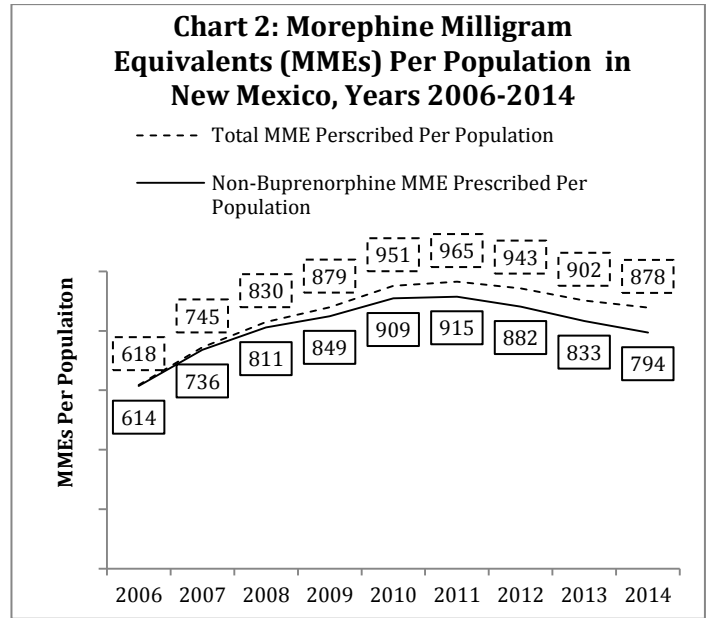
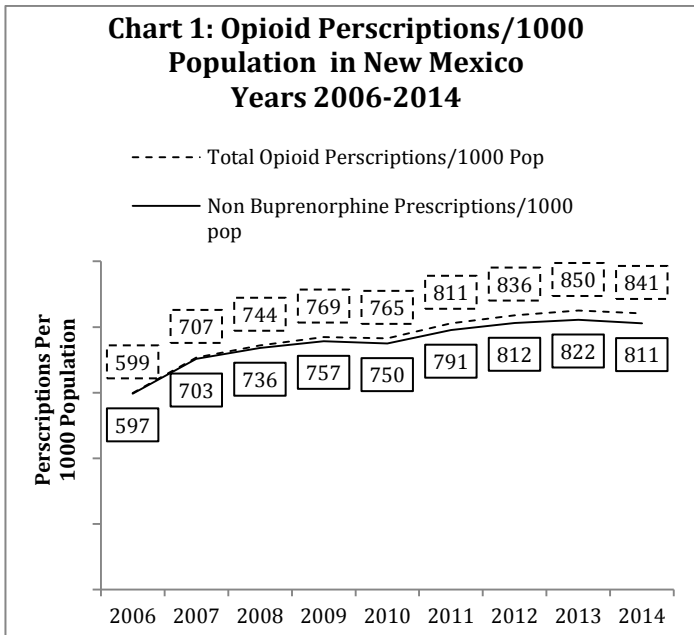


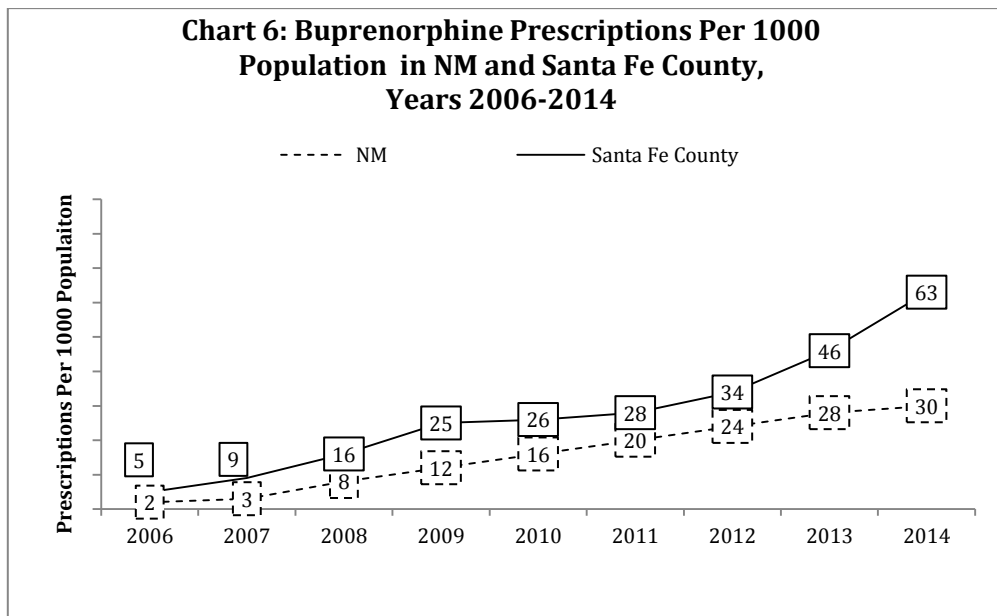
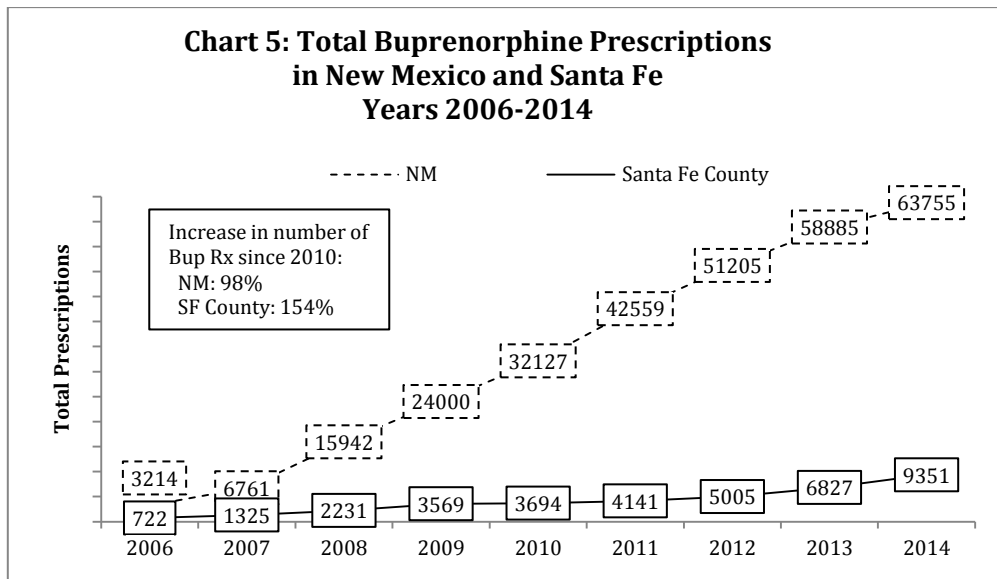
## Update on Opioid Prescriptions in New Mexico and Santa Fe County 2006-2014 Presented to Santa Fe Opiate Safe February 27, 2015

The charts below show the number of opioid prescriptions per 1000 population in years 2006-2014. Non-buprenorphine prescriptions have been separated out from total opioid prescriptions (mostly Subutex and Suboxone; Butrans left in when sourced) as these prescriptions are commonly prescribed for medication assisted treatment (MAT).

Charts 5 and 6 show the number of Buprenorphine prescriptions in NM and Santa Fe County. The majority of these prescriptions are Subutex and Suboxone, which are commonly used for medication assisted treatment (MAT). Butrans, also buprenorphine, is mainly used as a pain killer and is excluded from these data. Butrans accounted for approximately 5% of buprenorphine prescriptions in 2013. The number of buprenorphine prescriptions in New Mexico and Santa Fe County has increased steadily since 2006. Since 2010, the number of prescriptions increased 98% in New Mexico and 153% in Santa Fe County.
