
Underage Drinking and Drug Use

Among High School (9-12th grade) and Middle School (6th-8th grade) Students in Santa Fe County





11% of middle school students report having their first drink of alcohol **before the age of 11**.

18% of high school students report having their first drink of alcohol **before the age of 13**.

Youth who begin drinking before age 15 are four times more likely to develop alcohol dependence during their lifetime than those who begin drinking at age 21 or later.

Behaviors of Underage Drinkers




Where do students report usually consuming alcohol?

- 51% consume in someone else's home; 33% consume in their own home; 3% consume on school property.
- How do students obtain alcohol?
 - 39% obtain alcohol from someone giving it to them; 18% give someone else money to buy it for them.

What type of alcohol do students drink?

Liquor is the most common type of alcohol consumed, followed by beer and flavored malt beverages.







6.7% of middle school students tried marijuana before the age of **11**.


7.2% of high school students tried marijuana before the age of 13.

People who begin using marijuana before the age of 18 are 4 to 7 times more likely to develop a marijuana use disorder than adults.










The percent of youth who engage in underage drinking and drug use is decreasing.
