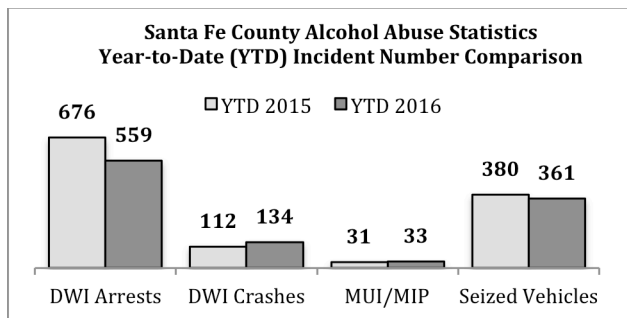

Monthly Summary:

During October 2016, law enforcement in Santa Fe County arrested 47 people for driving while intoxicated and 3 minors for being under the influence (MUI) or in possession of alcohol (MIP). There were 12 alcohol related crashes and 29 vehicles seized by law enforcement for alcohol related violations.

DWI Crashes and Arrests

- The number of **DWI crashes** increased from 112 in January through October of 2015 to 134 in January through October of 2016, a 19% increase.
- The number of **DWI arrests** decreased from 676 in January through October of 2015 to 559 in January through October of 2016, an 17% decrease.

Alcohol-Involved (A-I) Motor Vehicle Crash Death

- As of November 11, 2016 there were a total of 341 crash fatalities in New Mexico, 136 (39.9%) of which occurred due to an alcohol involved crash.
- As of November 11, 2016 there were 17 crash fatalities in Santa Fe County, 7 (41.2%) of which occurred due to an alcohol involved crash.

The chart below shows the twelve-month moving average trend analysis in the number of DWI crashes in Santa Fe County 2010-October 2016. Data show that there is little variation in the number of DWI crashes in Santa Fe County over the past 6 and a half years, except in the later part of 2013 and early 2014 where a dip in the average number of crashes is observed. The trend in the number of DWI crashes is increasing in the current year 2016.
